We had a great summer with lots of activities. The youth favorites included going to Waldameer and the Waterworld! For some it was their first time. I am amazed at how much they appreciate the Erie activities. Weekly fieldtrips would not have been possible without your generosity.

Erie Gives 2017 was the best yet! The House of Mercy had 49 donors (10 of which were new donors). We raised \$4795.08. The Sisters of Mercy were our largest donor giving \$1000. Thanks to all who supported the House of Mercy. After several years of saving and the support of the Sisters of Mercy the House of Mercy was able to purchase a 2016 Dodge Grand Caravan for ministry. 

A place of welcome hospitality for an east side Erie neighborhood, the House of Mercy, established and sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy, promotes a healthy neighborhood by providing activities and advocacy that engage children in positive experiences for them and their neighborhood.

The Eastside Grassroots Coalition, supported by the House of Mercy and the UECDC now has regular neighborhood meetings at the JFK Kids Café Center on the second Thursday of each month from 6:30-8:00pm. The November meeting will be Nov 2nd so neighbors and community members may hear from Kathy Dalkemper and Joe Schember before the election. Hope to see you there!

EGC boundaries include Buffalo Rd- Eastside Connector- McClelland and E 12th St.

The EGC prioritized community needs including:

- Street Safety and Road Conditions
- Opportunities for Young Adults and Jobs
- Vacant Lots, Blight, and Illegal Dumping
- Neighborhood Safety and Crime

During the end of the August House of Mercy program, youth supported by an Erie Community Foundation Grant and trained by Code Enforcement surveyed 670 properties along Buffalo Rd and the two blocks north and south from East Ave to McClelland to determine housing conditions and repair needs. In addition, House of Mercy youth, Mercyhurst University students, and Gannon Gives volunteers surveyed each household in the target area to determine needs and hopes.

The Sisters of Mercy, House of Mercy applied for the Neighborhood Assistance Tax Credit Program. Thanks to **Northwest Savings Bank for pledging \$25,000** to provide at least five housing improvement grants of \$5000 to five low-income families in the target area. Applications will be available in Jan. 2018.

The UECDC is currently working on a Planned Urban Garden Proiect.
